What is the GAT?

- The GAT is used to check your school and external based assessments have been accurately and fairly assessed
- The GAT used in the calculation of a derived exam score – it's an insurance policy
- Whilst you can't study for the GAT, you can do past papers to become familiar with the type of questions

The GAT is a single session three-hour test. There are two writing tasks and 70 multiple-choice questions.

You may complete the tasks in any order, but it is recommended that you complete the writing tasks first, then the multiple-choice questions. The following time allocations are recommended:

Writing Task 1	30 minutes
Writing Task 2	30 minutes
Multiple-choice questions	2 hours
TOTAL	3 hours

Answers to all tasks will be collected at the end of the three hours.

GAT – what you need

- To be lined up outside library OR sports centre (weather permitting) at least 15 minutes before
- ID which has your student number on it.
- IF you use other ID, you must have your student number from the timetable
- Stationery – **pencil, eraser, sharpener and pen**
–NO WHITEOUT
 - NO PENCIL CASES –clear bag if you have to
- Clear bottle – no labels
- Dictionary – no annotations
- No electronic devices

You will line up in your rows in the middle yard

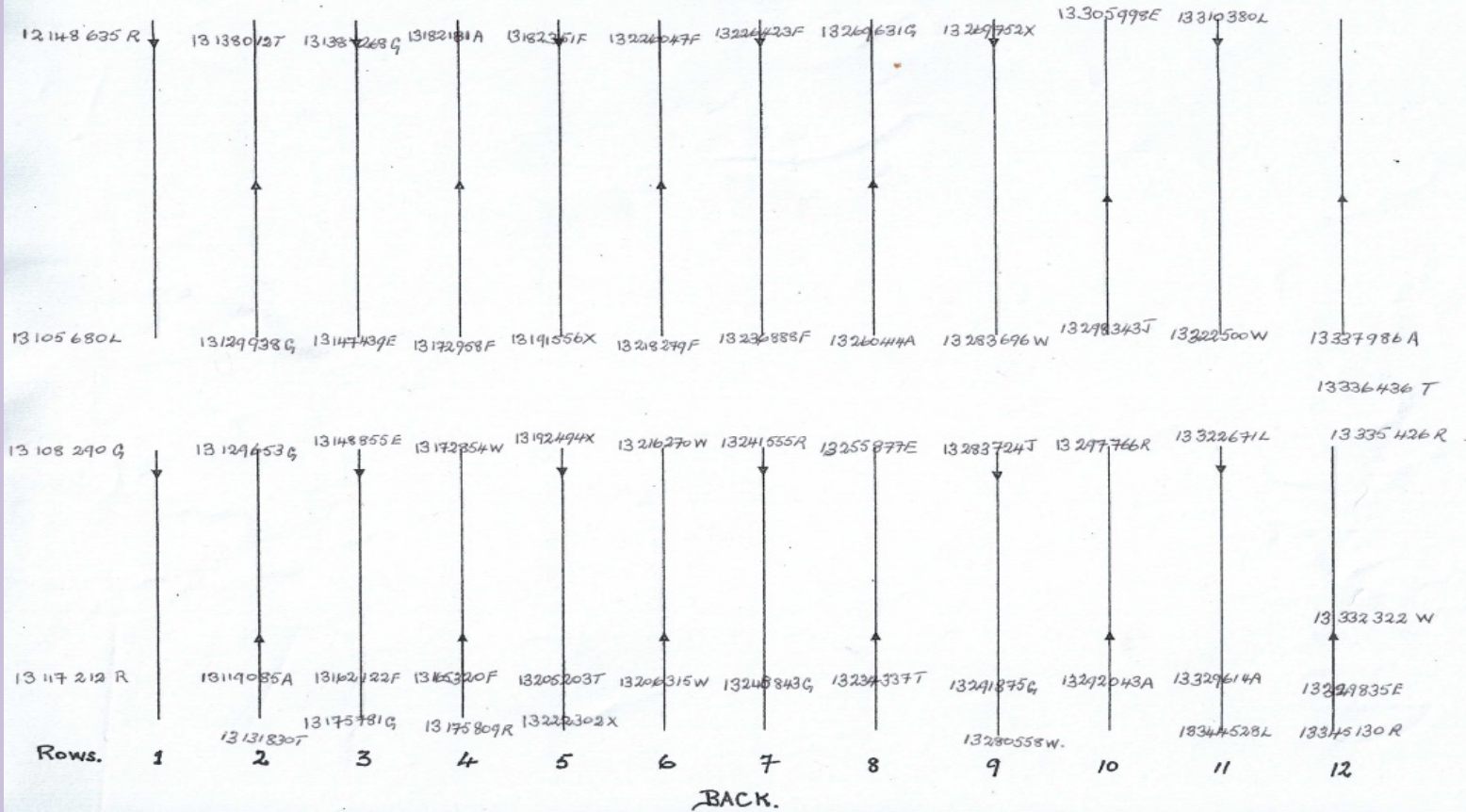
