# VCE VCAL POLICY

- Every VCE student and parent of a student will need to acknowledge reading to be enrolled in VCE
- This is the manual for how to pass and what to do if there is a problem

# VCE VCAL POLICY

- Key items in the policy
  - Attendance requirements – no less than 90% without documentation – Family holidays is not a valid reason
  - Absence from SACs require Medical Certificates and must be completed afterschool on a nominated day after school (likely Mondays)
  - ALT SAC form must be returned within 4 days of absence
  - SACs are conducted following VCAA rules

# VCE VCAL POLICY

- Key items in the policy
  - Special provisions for SACs ( extensions, use of computer etc) can be granted with appropriate documentation
  - Special provisions for VCAA exams have documents that must be sent by March 3
  - Student at risk – used to inform parents if you are not working and it is likely to impact your ability to successfully complete the VCE
  - Provisional “N” – used when SACs have not met a minimum standard to demonstrate knowledge and must be redone
  - Forms need to be returned to VCE Coordinator

# From the VCAA

## Satisfactory VCE Unit Result

The student receives S for a unit when all the outcomes are achieved

A student must:

- Produce work that demonstrates achievement of the outcome/s
- Observe school and VCAA rules

If a teacher judges that **all** outcomes are achieved, the student satisfactorily completes the unit.

The decision to award an ‘S’ for the unit **is distinct** from the assessment of levels of achievement.
