A word from the Principal



I wish to acknowledge the welcome I have personally received from the Brother's Community, staff, students, parents and Old Collegians in my first year as Principal of the College. I understand that I have been given the responsibility to work with all of you so that we can lead this Community. I also appreciate that being the first Principal, who is not a Brother, brings with it a particular responsibility and a necessary and deep respect for the past.

This is the fourth Lasallian school I have worked in, the others being De La Salle College, St James College and La Salle College, Green Hills in Manila. I have also spent time with Catholic Education Melbourne in a travelling role. There is a great deal to be grateful for in being a

member of the St Bede's Community.

I don't say that lightly. I have been in 58 of the 68 secondary schools of Melbourne, working with staff in one way or another. This has reinforced my view that St Bede's is a fine school with continuing possibilities.

Importantly, I come to St Bede's with a refined admiration for the brothers, staff, students and families who, over the past 80 years, have gone before me. This reinforces our theme for this year, *Celebrate the Tradition, Live the Gospel*. It speaks of appreciating and treasuring our past, whilst making sure that we live out our Christian identity in ways that are relevant to the time in which we live. Jesus understood the people of his time. He often quoted scripture to them (their memories of the past), but he re-explained it in a modern way that they understood. We are called to do the same. Respect the past, but serve the present, through genuine servant leadership.

There have been a number of significant events that have taken place so far this year, many of which are recorded in our regular newsletters. Amongst those events have been Year 7, 9 and 12 Retreats, our 80th Mass celebration, Mission Action Day (MAD) walk and fundraising and multiple Academic, Performing Arts and Sporting activities.






In The News

SBOCA Hall of Fame Inductee Stephen McBurney has been appointed the Australian Building and Construction Commissioner .


He began his five-year term in January after moving from his position with the Victorian Office of Chief Examiner.

In 1966 the signal honour of Dux of the College was bestowed upon Danny O'Keefe, whose distinguished record at St Bede's included winning the State Bank Bursary, a Commonwealth Secondary Scholarship and gaining the Matriculation prize in 1965 with an honour in physics.

A Special Bond

Eric Ludwick and Scott Benton

We received a letter from Carol Benton about a special friendship formed at St Bede's College during the 1980's—we thank all for letting us share this story of faith and friendship...

I'd like to tell you about ex-St Bede's pupil, Eric Ludwick, as his story is a wonderful example of the power of faith and I thought that it might be interesting for an assembly or a lesson. Eric is happy to share his story and his message. Eric was at St Bede's in the 1980's with my husband Scott, and with Luke Green, who may well remember him.

Eric is one of the most joyful people I know. He is also in the terminal stages of motor neurone disease. He was diagnosed 6 years ago and was angry and frightened. Through Christian radio station Vision, he found a deep faith which has sustained him as the disease progressed. He has spent the last 2 years in a hospice on a respirator, with bodily movement and function diminishing day by day. He can now only just hold up his head and has the tiniest of movement in his hands.

Eric says that as his physical world diminishes, his spiritual life expands and it is full of more love and joy than he could ever have imagined. He believes that he was given MND so that he could learn, and share his learning with others.

He has always been a talented musician, and in the last year formed a partnership with two music therapists at the hospice. Together they have written, performed and recorded an album of songs.


Eric believes his music is a gift from God and that he has a mission to share it. At his request, I wrote to Vision Christian Radio and told them his story. They recorded an interview with Eric, Scott and Stephan (one of the music therapists) and will play it, along with some of the music, next week. PS - Eric and Scott were great mates all through primary school and St Bede's years, but lost touch at 18 when Eric moved to Queensland. He returned shortly after his diagnosis and initially lived with his parents in Chelsea, where we live. A chance meeting with Eric's dad saw Scott and Eric reconnect. Their friendship was reestablished, but on a different, much deeper and more spiritual level. Reconnecting with Eric spurred Scott to organize a lunch for their primary school friends - he was in touch with some, and went on a mission to find more. Word has spread and new people come to each lunch, including one who travelled specially from Queensland. We're having one next week for his 53rd birthday, at the hospice. I am sure 'Eric's lunches' will continue after he leaves us. That is another wonderful legacy of an awful disease.

My Memories of St Bede's

I came from Iona in West Gippsland as a border in 1947and stayed for 3 years. As John Keyte points out we had little, or no, facilities.

For most of my stay there were no Lay teachers – only Brothers.

If my recollection is correct Mr Dale – who taught Geography, and was a returned Serviceman was the first Lay Teacher. He of course was nicknamed "Harry" (of Harry Dale The Drover fame).

In those days there were only 300 students, including 100

Boarders and Br Lewis initially was in charge of the Boarders. We was replaced by the well-known Bro Alban, whose credo was principally "I know a man who knows a man"!

Bro Alban was not good at remembering names and referred to most of us as "Lads".

Because of the relatively low numbers - low when compared to the current 1550 (approx.) Wednesday afternoons was totally set aside for sport and participation was mandatory.

Monsignor Brian Walsh (referred to as "Mousey") was my first School Captain. He was of course a very big man and had a personality to go with it.

Brother Finian was my favourite then and remained so to the end. During his later years, I visited him regularly and the past pupils and what they were doing were really his life's interest.

I personally have a fairly long history at St Bede's College as I currently have 2 grandsons at the College, Gerard Kelly goes into Year 12 and Damian into Year 10 in 2018. There are Kelly numbers 9 and 10 at St Bede's College 4 sons, 5 grandsons and yours truly. It is a wonderful place

Daniel Bull (Class of 1998)

Daniel is an Australian explorer and adventurer. In May 2008, after surviving a day in the Death Zone, Daniel successful completed an unguided ascent of Mt Everest. At the age of 23, Daniel became one of the youngest Australians to climb Mt Ama Dablam in the Himalayas, a peak once described by Sir Edmund Hillary as "unclimbable".

Earlier this year after his successful bid ascending the highest volcano in Antarctica, Daniel has became the first Australian to climb the highest mountain and highest volcano on every continent.

Daniel Bull is the youngest person on the planet to achieve this feat.

John has had a rich career in Africa, spanning 15 years. He is currently located in Mauritius working in Media and Communications and the Managing Director at PR Professionals Mauritius.
