You may be aware of recent media coverage regarding the potential access by young people to inappropriate video material through a variety of apps and websites. This material can be confronting and, in many situations, difficult to prevent your son being exposed to inadvertently. The large variety of devices your son would commonly have access to at home provides a challenge for parents to supervise.

A conversation with your son regarding what to do in the event of being confronted by inappropriate material is often the best course of action.
