



VCAL PARENTAL NOTIFICATION OF STUDENT AT RISK

The overall assessment of each VCAL Unit is measured on whether the 'Outcome' (key learning/skills) has been demonstrated by the student – this is reported as either 'Satisfactory' (S) or 'Not Satisfactory' (N) by the subject teacher. One criterion which needs to be met in order to successfully complete VCAL is the attainment of at least 10 units; a second criterion is attendance – if attendance is below expectations without reasonable evidence explaining the absence (such as medical certificates) then an 'N' will be awarded regardless.

A 'VCAL parental notification of student at risk' letter informs parents/guardians of issues with their son's level of performance in a Unit which, if unaddressed, would lead to an award of an "N".
