Welcome to our end of year edition of the Beda Boys Bulletin as we celebrate the Lasallian spirit. The Lasallian spirit is a unique bond between students past and present and one which is emphasized throughout the College.

Many fine examples of Beda Boys exemplifying this spirit exist throughout the community but one simple example was witnessed more than any other this year.

In one of the great sporting achievements, the performance of the Western Bulldogs in winning the AFL Premiership for the first time since 1954, was one of the

most remarkable in recent memory. Led by former St Bede's College student and former St Bede's Mentone Tigers coach, Luke Beveridge, the team continued to build momentum throughout the season despite a series of setbacks with injuries and player challenges. The team though, overcame the overwhelming obstacles and odds to record a historic victory.

At the center of this team orientated resurgence was Lukes' Lasallian spirit. This Lasallian spirit was best exemplified when Luke gave up his Premiership medal for the team's fallen Captain, Bob Murphy, who had been injured earlier in the year and missed playing in the Grand Final.

Beveridge, who in essence had spent his entire football life working towards this crowning achievement, thought first not of himself but of the less fortunate Murphy. Without hesitation, Luke displayed the spirit which makes him such a fine leader. Luke's leadership is trusted by his team and his leadership sets an example to those who surround him. These traits are the essence of Luke's spirit and character which he no doubt has exhibited throughout his life. On Grand Final day his character was unreservingly on display to an audience of millions.

The values held by Beveridge proudly represent the Lasallian values. These values put consideration of others ahead of oneself. For Beveridge, it was more important to recognize Bob Murphy than seek recognition for himself which he was certainly deserving of. The satisfaction of this gesture was far greater than any other to be found.

It is this character ethic which we are all bound by at St Bede's College A common respect and concern for others which is so successfully taught at the College. I for one am proud to be a part of a College which espouses these ethos. We can all display the same Lasallian spirit in our own lives and use the example that Luke set for us by extending our own Lasallian spirit towards those who surround us.

Thank you again for your support of the Old Collegians this year. Your support has continued to strengthen the Association. I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all an enjoyable festive season and I look forward to your involvement again next year.

From the Principal



This reflection is written by Old Collegian Patrick Donnellan (Class of 1999) who volunteered his time and expertise to participate in the College's Thailand outreach volunteer program to the De La Salle School in Sanklaburi, Thailand. The group included ten current St Bede's College students, three St Bede's College staff and Patrick. They were assigned two tasks. One, the building of a small home for the housekeeper on the school site; and two, the levelling out and building of a Petaque field for the use by future students of the school.

"In September this year I was fortunate enough to join the St Bede's College teachers and students on their volunteer trip to the De La Salle School in Sanklaburi. For a long time, I had heard of other volunteer trips where different organisations have given up

their time to go overseas and help others in need. Being a Builder I have always wanted to use my skills for a good cause and help others. I have always thought of it as a genuine way to have a symbolic and physical impact that could have the potential to bring all kinds of different people together.

Initially the main challenge for me was leaving my wife and two daughters for over two weeks. Like most parents the time you spend with your family is the time where you are most at peace. Not to mention the guilt I felt for leaving my wife with all of the parental duties so I could selfishly pursue a life long goal. My wife, whose work load was about to be doubled by me going away, remained completely optimistic and supportive and without her support I could not have embraced and enjoyed this lifelong changing experience like I did. In the lead up to the trip I had to keep reminding myself that in a year's time, the short time away from my family would be insignificant in the grand scheme of things.

When I jumped on the bus, ready to depart for the airport I was basically a stranger to the staff and students. The staff were so welcoming and inclusive and the students appeared to be totally open to this whole experience even though no one really knew what to expect. I instantly felt a part of the crew.

Once we had arrived at our home for the next two weeks I was keen to start building. I was there to get things done. I felt like my personality and patience would be a strength when we began building as I knew the resources were limited and the language barriers would throw up all kinds of problems. However, I had no idea how difficult this would in fact be. Throw in ten new apprentices (the St Bede's College students) for their first day of work and things got interesting. I initially viewed this trip as me leading a building team to build structures for the school. What I didn't realize was this would be the less significant role I would play.

On reflection, when we started to work as a team, building for the school, was when my admiration for the students began. I can honestly say there was not one student who didn't give 100% of what they were capable of. Observing them work I felt a combination of being their friend and a parental figure, cautious of their feelings and how they were going about their jobs. As I was the 'new guy' I was the subject of the student's jokes and most of their daily banter. This enabled me to get to know the students better. As the days progressed I was so proud of the boys and their hard work. This was a true reflection of their kind hearted intentions of giving something back.

When we had breaks from the building site, we embarked on fun activities with the school kids and for me this is when the real fun started. I still cannot articulate how wonderful an experience this was. Perhaps it is a combination of how genuine and beautiful the souls of the orphans and teachers are, how happy they seemed to be without having much at all, how friendly and loving they are, or how brave they are to open themselves up to strangers without any reservations, knowing full well that they may not see many of us again after this experience.

All of the St Bede's College crew formed friendships with the children of the school. Most lucky enough to build one or two extra special bonds. I was lucky enough to form a special bond with Wanepon, who is a beautiful 12 year old girl. Although we didn't speak the same language it didn't matter. Her kind soul, generosity and love of life were infectious. The trip brought many emotional ups and downs along the way. On one particular night I was missing my family terribly and also upset that I was about to leave all of these people behind, people I had genuinely made remarkable and everlasting relationships with. I found myself questioning the experience. Was the experience more beneficial for me or for them? These feelings were quickly put to the side as I witnessed the St Bede's College staff and students experiencing the same questions/ feelings. On our last night we had a beautiful ceremony to celebrate our trip. It was a therapeutic way of uniting the students of the school and the St Bede's College crew for life. It also enabled us to say goodbye.

Now that we are home, I really hope the students of St Bede's College know how truly proud I am of them. And if they ever needed anything form me all they need to do is ask. I miss their daily banter and know I have made everlasting friendships with the boys. When I ask myself who the experience benefitted more.....myself or the students of the De La Salle School, I am still unsure. If I was asked to do it again, I would do it in a heartbeat. If I was ever asked do I recommend this experience, I would say "If it does not challenge you it won't change you and progress is impossible without change".

Thank you again Brother Garry for enabling me to fulfil a life ling goal and be a part of this amazing and

unique experience.



Current St Bede's College students Peter Russell, Joel Bright and Will Clifton in partnership with Brighton Secondary School in Adelaide SA merged to formed Infinitude, one of three teams representing Australia at the F1 in Schools World Finals held in conjunction with the U.S Grand Prix in Austin, Texas in October 2016.

Through hard work, determination and support the team were able to bring home the Second Place trophy after their vehicle smashed the world record. An incredible achievement to be recognised on the world stage in a competition where twenty million students from forty four different countries compete!

Dr Rolf Gomes (Class of 1991)



Dr Rolf Gnomes studied Engineering after graduating from St Bede's College in 1991. After several years working as an electrical engineer, Rolf returned to study at the University of Queensland, graduating with a medical degree. He then completed his cardiology specialty training at the Prince Charles and Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospitals.

As a young registrar in the Australian bush, Rolf experienced the challenges of trying to diagnose and treat patients without the specialised services and equipment available to city patients. His experience as an engineer sort to solve this problem!

Rolf began plans to develop a mobile clinic; a service that delivers first-class speciality services to rural and remote communities in Australia. The Heart of Australia mobile clinic is a custom-built, \$1.5 million, 25 m long semi-trailer with specialist diagnostic equipment and technology, staffed by a team of cardiologists and respiratory specialists on a rotating roster.

Since its first trip two years ago the "Heart Bus" has conducted 4,283 consultations with 2,388 patients; more than 250 patients have required urgent treatment with 30 referred for open heart surgery. An estimated 82 lives saved and a significant reduction in hospital stays.

James Bertschik (Class of 2006)



In September this year Frankston City Council welcomed the launch of the city's first dedicated co-working space and business hub in the heart of Frankston.

Known as the Frankston Foundry, the initiative aims to turn office space into an innovative business hub for the next 6 months.

Michael (Mick) Stephenson ASM (Class of 1984)



One of the State's most experienced MICA paramedics, Michael began his career with Ambulance Victoria in 1996 and helped formulise new clinical guidelines and education for the management of cardiac arrest.

Michael is responsible for the provision of quality state-wide emergency ambulance operations, including planning and delivery of specialist state-wide services such as Air Ambulance, using Advanced Life Support and Mobile Intensive Care paramedics, Ambulance Community Officers and Community Emergency Response Teams.

On Australia Day 2015, Michael was awarded the Ambulance Service Medal as part of the Australia Day honours.

CMDR Darren Grogan (Class of 1987)



The command of the Australian Navy's largest "seagoing service station" was handed over from Commander Darren Grogan to Commander Michael Oborn in December 2015.

GMDR Darren Grogan joined the Royal Australian Navy as a Supplementary List officer in 1988. After graduating from the Royal Australian Naval College, Jervis Bay he completed his basic Seaman Officer training ashore in HMA Ships *Watson* and *Cerberus* and at sea in HMA Ships *Jervis Bay, Torrens* and *Geelong*. He joined HMAS *Perth* in 1989 where he was awarded his Bridge Watch keeping Certificate.

After many years of studying and working his way through the ranks, CMDR Grogan assumed Command of HMAS *Sirius* in December 2013. The statistics for the ship under Commander Grogan's leadership were impressive: *Sirius* steamed the equivalent of three times around the earth at the equator and conducted 71 underway replenishments, transferring the equivalent of 5.2 Olympic-sized swimming pools. Before handing the ship over, Commander Grogan emphasised the value of team work in every situation.

Brenton Avdulla (Class of 2008)



Brenton Avdulla left St Bede's College in Yr 10 to take up an apprenticeship with the Moloney Family. He finished second in the Victorian apprentices' premiership in 2008/09 with 86 winners before he moved to Sydney to link up with Hall OFame trainer Gai Waterhouse.

Brenton scored his first Group I win aboard the Graeme Beggtrained Secret Admirer in the 2010 Flight Stakes at Randwick and is now rated among the top five jockeys in Sydney.

Brenton first major winner was Count Encosta in 2010. His first Group One winner was Secret Admirer in the 2010 Coolmore Flight Stakes

His most recent major winner however was at the highest level when Lasqueti Spirit won the Group One Crown Oaks during this years Spring Carnival at Flemington.

On 17 November, 2014 Old Collegian Jack Vawdrey's life changed. A misjudged dive into a mate's pool has catastrophic ramifications. Jack fractured his neck and is classified as an incomplete quadriplegic. Jack tackles his new set of challenges with tenacity and courage. It is this steely determination that makes Jack a prime candidate for pioneering nerve transfer surgery performed by Austin Health. Jacks progress has been amazing.

There is a long way to go but with the assistance of "The Next Step" Spinal Cord Injury Recovery, Jacks desire and drive to be independent will happen.


It was a great game played in great spirit and the perfect practice match for the current College students before the season started.

Sam was Club Champion in 2006 and a joint winner with Luke Wintle in 2008. In 2006 Sam also won the Michael Hecker Memorial Most Consistent Trophy and was a VAFA state rep in 2007 / 2008. Sam was named in the VAFA Team of the Year in 2007. Sam was one of the club's Assistant Coaches in 2009 / 2010. Brian Dillon (Class of 1946)

After working in industry in Melbourne and Sydney, and running his own building maintenance company for eight years, Brian joined the Australian Trade Commissioner Service in 1963. He subsequently served as Australian Trade Commissioner in Italy, Egypt, Malta, India, Spain and finally in the Philippines – where he was Minister (Commercial) at the Australian Embassy in Manila. Brian was then seconded by the T.C. Service to the United Nations Development Programme, where, for 10 years, he was Director of the UNDP Program of Coal Utilisation Technology, training the developing countries of Asia in clean coal utilisation and environmental protection. Brian is now settled in Sydney and – God willing and to his surprise – will be turning 88 in January.

We recently received a note from Brian: "I enjoyed, as always, reading of the news and successes—and, sadly, bereavements—of the Beda old boys. Living in Sydney makes one feel "of another world" at times and just as separated as I was during my 26 years in the Foreign Service. Though hearing frequent reports of his activities, our meetings were infrequent. (We had a great time together when he stayed with us when I was serving in Rome.

St Bede's Mentone Tigers have resumed pre-Christmas training with good numbers attending under a new coaching panel made up of predominantly St Bede's Old Boys led by Sam Anstey (2015 Victorian coach of the year) with Anthony Scafidi and Luke Wintle (all 3 are SBMT triple premiership players) as assistant coaches and Peter Laspatzis as the new Development team coach.

The Tigers earnt promotion from VAFA Premier B into Premier Division after an excellent season where they were either 1st or 2nd on the Premier B ladder most of the season. St Bede's won the 2nd semi-final against Beaumaris by 27 points to earn automatic promotion to Premier Division but fell 31 points short in the grand Final against the same opponents. The Development Team after a very up-and-down season had a very good win against Parkdale by 10 points in the 1st semi-final but unfortunately went down to Old Scotch in the preliminary final. Both Under 19 teams had excellent seasons making the finals but both lost their 1st semi-finals in close encounters.

The Tigers are keen to add to their current batch of recruits and returnees as they begin a new chapter with their second-ever stint in VAFA Premier Division. The club will again be fielding a Thirds team as well as two Under 19s and for the very first time a senior women's team in the VAFA.

St Bede's Mentone Tigers have previously had 2 girls' teams (U13 and U15) in the SMJFL and will be increasing that to 4 junior teams (U12, U14, U16, and U18) plus the seniors and is actively recruiting across all grades after having secured a very experienced women's coach in ex-Fitzroy senior women's coach, John Marshall.

2017 is already shaping as a very exciting year for this very family-oriented club now boasting a full pathway for both boys and girls in Australian Rules football.

My time at De La Salle Malvern in 1937 and then as one of the new boarders at Mentone in 1938 with my brother Frank was a challenging experience for a twelve year old from Bairnsdale. A new school with none of the modern comforts enjoyed by our modern day students, but the beach was just over the road and that was a bonus.

Now aged 90 I almost feel like the last man standing...My education and experience at St Bede's College has enabled me to have a good life and a satisfying career and I know that the spirituality and temporal values will continue to be passed on to future generations, keeping our nation Christian.

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
