What is VET/VETDSS?

Vocational Education & Training Delivered to Secondary Students (VET)

VET Delivered to Secondary Students refers to Vocational Education and Training (VET) courses undertaken as part of a student's school studies. VET courses enable students to earn credit towards a recognised VET qualification while they complete their senior secondary certificate.

A VET course allows students to:

- Combine a vocational pathway with their VCE or VCE/VM studies
- Complete (or work towards) a Certificate I, II, or III qualification
- Keep their options open to pursue further vocational education (such as courses at a TAFE or RTO) or move into higher education (such as undertaking courses at university via non-ATAR pathways).
- Genuine industry and employability skills

Selecting a VET Course

We ask students to nominate 3 preferences for VET during subject selection. While we work closely with the TAFE providers to offer students their first preference, we can't guarantee everyone a place in their preferred course or their preferred TAFE. There are external factors that may limit the number of places provided. In those instances, students will be offered their reserve choice. Please note: a VET course is compulsory for students undertaking the VCE Vocational Major Program. Regular attendance at TAFE is compulsory for students undertaking a VET study. Students are required to make their own way to and from TAFE.

Advantages of VETDSS

There are many advantages to completing Vocational Education and Training (VET) in school. Upon completion it can provide you with:

- A VCE and/or VM certificate and a Nationally recognised VET certificate issued by a registered training organisation (RTO)
- An enhanced ATAR which can improve access to further education.
- Pathways to employment and/or further VET qualifications and training.
- Workplace experience gained through structured workplace learning (SWL).

What is TAFE?

TAFE institutes are government funded Registered Training Organizations (RTO's) that offer Vocational Education and Training relating to a specific industry or occupation.

St Bede's College have strong associations with Holmesglen and Chisholm, TAFE's, with Box Hill, Kangan Institute and other RTO's available depending on VET requirements.

What is an R.T.O.?

A registered training organization (RTO) is a provider and assessor of nationally recognised vocational education and training. They can offer students training and qualifications or statements of attainment that are recognized across Australia and are accepted by industry and other educational institutions.

What is a SBAT?

A School Based Apprenticeship Traineeship (SBAT) is an Australian Apprenticeship which is undertaken part-time while the apprentice or trainee is at school. It combines paid employment, on or off the job vocational training and senior secondary school studies.

A SBAT provides senior secondary students with hands-on industry experience, and the ability to work towards or complete a nationally recognized qualification, while they complete their senior school certificate.

Students are encouraged to commence SBAT's through the VCE VM program.

Students undertaking School Based Apprenticeship Training (SBAT) will undertake SWL with their host employer as well as on the job training, whilst attending TAFE in blocks throughout the year.

How long are VET courses?

VET courses generally run for two years, whilst the student is completing Yr 11 & Yr 12 with classes held one day or half day a week during school terms at an RTO. VCE Students should ensure this option does not clash with their internal subject choices. We do request an afternoon classes for our VCE students to attend TAFE, and students are required to attend school up until recess on their VET days.

What do I obtain at the end?

When you complete a VET course, you will either be awarded a Statement of Attainment for partial completion or an industry recognised certificate for the course completed eg: Certificate II or III in Hospitality

Are there any prerequisites?

To enroll in a VET course, you must be older than 15 years, with some RTO's and VET courses requiring a minimum age of 16 years old. Students must be enrolled as full-time student at St Bede's College. Please note several courses require a competent pass in Yr 10 Math and English eg: Certificate II Electrotechnology and a pre-entrance testing for Cert 111 Allied Health Services.

VET courses indicative fees for 2026

There will be an additional fee that will be added to your school fees for each student completing a VET course with the remaining VET fee paid for by St Bede's College (avg. cost of a VET course is \$2,500). For any VET fee in excess of \$3,600 the difference is payable by the family. Additional costs are student's expenses for materials eg: Uniform (trades, hospitality, appropriate PPE uniform), relevant tools and textbooks required by the TAFE are to be paid for by the family.

Enrolment Process

Students need to research and gather information on at least three VET courses of interest. During subject selection, students are required to input their VET choice, noting 1st preference, 2nd preference and 3rd preference. Application for enrolment will be submitted with the relevant TAFE by the College VET coordinator.

A student's VET subject selection does not mean direct enrolment – due to the popularity of some course's placement is not guaranteed. VET selection is dependent on availability by the TAFE / RTO.

Holmesglen applicants will receive an email confirming VET enrolment will be sent to the students for acceptance. Chisholm applicants will receive an E-form request. Enrolment processes MUST be actioned and completed by the student before the enrolment can proceed. Chisholm & Holmesglen TAFE have an online assessment (BKSB) for some VET courses that must also be completed by the student prior to enrolment being accepted.

In the event the student commences the VET course and decides they do not wish to continue, they <u>must</u> advise the VET coordinator in the **first 3 weeks of study (before the end of February)**.

It is best for students not to apply for a VET course because their friend has applied. Students must be dedicated and interested in this pathway of study as they are required to attend and complete the selected VET course for 2 years.

We encourage any students interested in VET subjects to speak with the VM or VET Coordinators to find out more.

What is VCE Vocational Major (VM)?

The VCE Vocational Major (VM) offers an applied learning pathway within the VCE, providing students the flexibility to pursue their specific interests. Through real-life workplace experiences, the program equips students with the essential skills and confidence to navigate their transition into further study or the workforce.

VCE Vocational Major (VM) Structure?

Year 11 & 12 students undertaking the VCE-VM will choose from one of the following pathways:

VCE VM: Subject-Based

Students will undertake five days of VCE Vocational Major schooling at St Bede's College. Their program will include the following VCE studies:

- VCE-VM Literacy or VCE English
- VCE-VM Numeracy or VCE Mathematics
- VCE-VM Work-Related Skills
- VCE-VM Personal Development Skills
- One additional VCE study from the available subjects
- VET Cert 11 in Workplace Skills

VETDSS at TAFE: One day per week

 TAFE: One day (or part day) per week to complete their Cert II or Cert III VET Course

VCE VM: Industry-Based

Students will undertake three days of VCE Vocational Major schooling at St Bede's College. Their program will include the following VCE studies:

- VCE-VM Literacy
- VCE-VM Numeracy
- VCE-VM Work-Related Skills
- VCE-VM Personal Development Skills

VETDSS at TAFE and SWL: One day per week for VET & SWL

- TAFE: One day (or part day) per week to complete their Cert II or Cert III VET Course
- Structured Workplace Learning (SWL): One day per week
- SWL provides students with the opportunity to integrate on-the-job experience with their VCE-VM and VET studies
- Students will work with an employer in their related VET industry one day per week

Generally, students undertaking VM-Industry learning will attend school on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday with Wednesday set aside for VET and Friday for SWL (*days may vary, depending on allocated VET at TAFE)

What is Structured Workplace Learning? (SWL)

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) provides students with the opportunity to integrate practical on-the-job experience and learnings in an industry with nationally recognised VET undertaken as part of with the VCE-VM units.

It is the responsibility of the students, with their family's assistance, to source a relevant business/employer in the industry that the student is studying their VET for SWL placement. Best practice is for students to make contact with family and friends who may work in the industry and ask if they can obtain one day per week SWL placement with their business.

Students develop an understanding about what is needed to be a competent worker in a specific industry related to their VET they are undertaking. Work exploration is a vital component of SWL that allows students to explore career options and enhance skill development, which may be transferable, enhancing employment opportunities.

A work placement enables students to better understand employability skills linked to the workplace. Employability skills are more easily learnt on the job and employers are ideally placed to provide the opportunity for students to practice employability skills in a work environment.

SWL is an integral and compulsory part of the St Bede's College VM -Industry Based program and every student will be required to complete SWL one day per week with an employer in the industry they are studying at TAFE. Most students will complete their SWL arrangements on a Friday, unless their VET day falls on a Friday, then the SWL day will be on a Wednesday.

A legal requirement of SWL is the completion of SWL Arrangement and SWL Travel forms. These SWL forms ensure students have WorkSafe Insurance whilst on placement. SWL forms must be completed and signed by all parties and approved by our College Principal prior to SWL commencing. (WorkSafe Insurance does not cover accidents that occur on the way to or from the workplace).

Students undertaking School Based Apprenticeship Training (SBAT) will undertake SWL with their host employer as well as on the job training, whilst attending TAFE in blocks throughout the year.

The contribution of a scored VCE VET program is as follows:

- Any contribution to the ATAR is subject to satisfactory completion of the designated Units 3 and 4 sequence.
- Study scores will contribute directly to the ATAR, either as one of the student's best four studies (the primary four) or as a fifth or sixth study.
- A contribution to the ATAR is subject to receiving a study score
- Students may choose not to receive a study score; however, in that
 case they will not be eligible for any ATAR contribution from the
 Units 3 and 4 sequence of that scored VCE VET program.
- Block Credit Recognition Students that undertake qualifications that are not approved by VCAA may also be eligible for credit towards their VCE through Block Credit. This is achieved by being awarded successful completion of units of competency.

CERTIFICATE 111 IN ALLIED HEALTH ASSISTANCE (HLT33015)

Prior to enrolment, students will be required to complete a literacy and numeracy assessment (BKSB test) and answer some course-specific, contextualised questions. This will help determine the prospective student's suitability to the course.

Students must have the:

interpersonal skills to interact with the public / clients / patients / superiors and other staff physical ability to attend to clients / patients in a hospital, rehabilitation or community health setting fine motor skills and physical dexterity required to assemble pieces of equipment, such as crutches and strength needed to move equipment such as a trolley, wheelchair or rehabilitation equipment.

This course is perfect for any students wishing to continue study or work in the Allied Health or Health Industry as an Allied Health Assistant and Allied Services Assistant and is delivered as a two-year part time course.

The course will be delivered through a mixture of online activities, classroom delivery and laboratories, including in a state-of-the-art allied health laboratory, community apartment and a simulated hospital environment. During this course, learners will gain industry specific training in basic medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, infection control, workplace health and safety, communication in the health industry and working with difficult clients. They will also develop practical skills in patient movement and mobility, taking clinical measurements and first aid.

As part of study of this course, learners will be required to come into close contact with other students and there will be a requirement of physical contact with other students in order to complete some assessments. Holmesglen has implemented a range of protocols and policies in order to maintain health and safety of students including additional cleaning, wearing of PPE and undertaking Federal Government COVID safe training. All students and staff will be expected to comply with these procedures.

The Certificate II in Animal Care is the course for you if you are looking to build a career in the animal care industry or working with animals. This general qualification is designed to get you ready for work under supervision in animal shelters, kennels, catteries, sanctuaries veterinary clinics and animal product retailers.

Through theoretical and practical coursework, you will learn to:

- Provide care to a range of animals
- Monitor and maintain animal health
- Practice hygiene and infection control
- Respond to expectations of pet owners
- Understand what is required in running a small companion animal business

CERTIFICATE 11 IN APPLIED FASHION DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY (MST20616)

This course is a starting point if you are interested in further study and a career in the fashion design field, in a variety of different areas. These could include fashion design, pattern making and drafting, production, marketing or styling.

The course provides an introductory overview of fashion design, which may lead to employment opportunities producing fashion products where a basic understanding of design skills is required. It is particularly suitable for those who aspire to start their own small fashion business or undertake repairs and alterations for themselves or others. While on campus, learners will have access to the Adobe Design software.

This course is designed to introduce students to the theory and practice of automotive maintenance and repair in a hands-on learning environment and focuses on providing students with simulated practical work experiences, employability skills and career pathways into the automotive industry as an apprentice.

All applicants to complete BKSB test in both literacy and numeracy, and demonstrate capacity in reading, writing, numeracy, oracy and learning. Students must have digital capability, White card (CPCCWHS1001) is required for site visits and will be delivered as part of the course

During the course you will gain experience in using hand and power tools, and learn a wide range of carpentry skills, including how to install windows and doors, wall framing, interior fixing and roofing.

This course opens up employment opportunities in the building construction and building design industries by providing the skills and knowledge you need for the carpentry and building trades.

Delivered over two years to students currently enrolled in senior secondary school, the duration of the qualification allows students to achieve a partial completion while completing their normal secondary school studies.

This scored VCE VET qualification, reflects the role of individuals in a variety of Business Services job roles. It is likely that these individuals are establishing their own work performance. Individuals in these roles carry out a range of routine procedural, clerical, administrative or operational tasks that require technology and business skills. They apply a broad range of competencies using some discretion, judgment and relevant theoretical knowledge. They may provide technical advice and support to a team.

Must demonstrate capacity in reading, writing, numeracy, oracy and learning with a Year

10 Mathematics and English is preferred.

CERTIFICATE 11 IN CABINET MAKING AND TIMBER TECHNOLOGY (MSFG20322)

Complete a pre-training BKSB assessment for language, literacy and numeracy skills. Students must be currently enrolled and studying at Year 10 level or above.

The aim of this certificate is to provide learners with basic industry specific skills and knowledge to enable transition into an apprenticeship of a particular trade stream within one of the building and construction industry sectors at the Certificate III level.

CERTIFICATE 11 IN COMMUNITY SERVICES (CHC22015)

Complete a pre-training BKSB assessment for language, literacy and numeracy skills. Students must be 16 years of age in January of the year the course commences. Requirements must have Year 10 Maths and English level or above and students are required to attend compulsory information sessions before their applications are accepted.

Please note: The course covers sensitive areas and issues which may trigger learners who have experienced topics covered.
